# Your Budget

Time To Crunch The Numbers

## **Estimate Your Budget**

I'm a numbers girl so running them any time I start a project is a must. I love knowing exactly how much I'm going to spend on something, and if I have a general idea of what something it going to cost but can't find exact numbers, I give myself a 10%–15% buffer.

Here are some rough numbers of what you can expect when planning a project. These numbers reflect low to mid-range cost estimates.

Keep in mind that the more elaborate and complex the project, the more likely you'll need to involve a professional and the more expensive the project will get.

#### COST EXAMPLES:

Deck Build :	\$1,000-\$15,000
Patio or Pathway :	free-\$10,000
Sod Install :	\$500-\$3,000
Soil, Mulch or Rock :	free-\$8,000
Retaining Wall :	\$5,000-\$15,000
Pond Install :	\$1,500-\$4,000
Fire Pit :	\$50-\$500
Pergola :	\$50-\$5,000
Lighting :	\$50-\$500
Patio Furniture :	free-\$7,500
BBQ :	\$100-\$2,500

## **Important Note!**

I've noted some free items in the list because there are many resources out there that could help bring the cost of your project down. For example, some of our vegetable beds were built using pallets that we were able to pick up for free. Wood is expensive people!!

Don't think you can get a BBQ for \$100? Our first BBQ was off of Kijiji and it was \$80. If you're looking to revamp your yard on a budget, it's a great place to start.



# **Picking Your Products**

Items Picked Based On Your Budget

## Now What?

Now that you've established your theme, your wishlist, and your budget, it's time to start picking materials and items. You'll want to make a list of things you might need depending on your project.

For example, let's look at building a few raised vegetable beds. Here are the things you might need:

- Wood
- Screws
- Landscape Cloth
- Tools
- Garden Soil
- Plants (or seedlings that you started)
- A rain barrel if you wanted one



### **Alternatives**

We've all heard the "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" line as kids. Your yard is the best time to apply this.

If you have a car, its tires likely need replacing roughly every 4-6 years depending on how and how often you drive.

A great way to upcycle tires is to use them as a planter. The rubber keeps the soil temperature consistent and they're great when used to overwinter certain plants like strawberries or lavender! Our oregano has always done exceptionally well in the tire and it comes back every year.

- For smaller projects, it's rarely worth it unless you know someone.


